"There's A Wideness In God's Mercy"

Psalm 103:8-12 – NIV

- ⁸ The Lord is compassionate and gracious,
slow to anger, abounding in love.
- ⁹ He will not always accuse,
nor will he harbor his anger forever;
- ¹⁰ he does not treat us as our sins deserve
or repay us according to our iniquities.
- ¹¹ For as high as the heavens are above the earth,
so great is his love for those who fear him;
- ¹² as far as the east is from the west,
so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

Matthew 5:7 – NIV

- ⁷ Blessed are the merciful,
for they will be shown mercy.

Takeaway: There's a wideness in God's mercy like the wideness of the sea. God stretches us to open up our hearts, minds, and hands so that our mercy looks more like the God in Christ who simply says, "Follow me. Watch how I do it, and go and do likewise."
